DEA and its partners will collect tablets, capsules, patches, and other solid forms of prescription drugs. Liquid products, such as cough syrup, should remain sealed in their original container. The cap must be tightly sealed to prevent leakage. The Sanbornton Police Department is located at 573 Sanborn Road. This is a <u>free and anonymous</u> disposal of unneeded medications.
